



City implements a weekly street cleaning pilot program

Beginning Monday, September 8th, the City will begin a weekly street cleaning pilot program for the benefit of all of their residents.

They will use alternate side of the street parking, beginning with the "even" number side of the street first, and "odd" side of the street the next day, as listed on the schedule on the back of the Newsletter. The City asks that residents either

park vehicles on the "alternate" side of the street on the days listed, in a parking lot, or a driveway if one is available, to enable the sweeper to perform at its maximum levels.

Some questions you may have:

Question: What if the weather is inclement and the sweeper cannot operate?

Answer: The City will stick to the schedule, and on those days that the sweeper cannot operate due to inclement weather, a breakdown in machinery, or some other unforeseen incident, the street (or streets) scheduled for that day will be

swept on the NEXT normally scheduled date.

Question: How will we be notified in advance that our street will not be swept?

Answer: An announcement will be posted on the City website at www.newcastlecity.delaware.gov by 7:15 a.m. advising of any day street cleaning will be cancelled. Or you can call the City's message line at 221- 4534 for recorded updates.

Question: What if a City holiday falls on my scheduled day?

Answer: The street (or streets) scheduled for that day will be swept on the NEXT normally scheduled date.

Next Steps for MSC Water System

The Municipal Services Commission's Water Department is evaluating a Mobile Treatment System for the removal of PFC Compounds from the City's water supply.



Preliminary figures reflect that this will be a more cost effective temporary solution than purchasing water. The Commission is also working with the State of Delaware to find funding sources to assist with the cost of implementing a permanent treatment system.

-Most home improvements projects require a New Castle City Building Permit. All necessary permits must be obtained by the homeowner or contractor prior to beginning work. This includes applications to the Historic Area Commission (HAC) for properties located within the Historic District.

-All businesses/contractors working in the City must obtain a New Castle City Business License prior to working in the City.
