Trustees Scholarship Reminder...

The "Trustees of New Castle Common Scholarship Fund" was established in 1983 for eligible residents of the City of New Castle.

An applicant must be a senior in high school or a recent high school graduate who is entering the freshman year in an accredited undergraduate college or university as a full-time student in the coming September. Funded applicants from previous years who continue to meet the eligibility requirements are invited to re-apply for grant funding if available.

The scholarships are awarded on the basis of financial need and scholastic ability. If the applicant is a dependent, the parent must be a resident of the City of New Castle.

Applications and instructions are available from the Trustees of New Castle Common, 201 Delaware Street, New Castle.

Note that student's application and a transcript of final grades must be received by the Scholarship Committee no later than July 1, 2015.

Important City Tax exemption information

The new year is the time for residents to apply for the over 65 or Disability property tax exemption. To make an appointment, at the convenience of the taxpayer, call Kathleen Walls at 322-9804.

The maximum yearly income requirements are \$15,000 for a single person and \$30,000 for a married couple. Social Security income is not counted toward the maximum. The <u>last day</u> to apply is May 1st.

Code Enforcement Corner

City Code Enforcement helps to maintain and improve the quality of life of New Castle City residents by administering an unbiased enforcement program to correct violations of City zoning, property maintenance and building codes;

Complaint forms are available at the City Offices or on the City Web site at newcastlecity.delaware.gov. Complaints are handled on a confidential basis; however, if feedback and/or updates are requested, name, address and phone number need to be provided with the complaint.

It is the responsibility of property owners to maintain the sidewalk in front of their property within 24 hours of the end of a weather event.

The New Castle City Code, section 209-1: Sidewalks require a minimum 3 feet of clearance within 24 hours of a snow event ending. One should not anticipate warm weather following a storm to clear the sidewalk.

§ 94-1: Defecation on public or private property prohibited; owner to remove feces. Please clean up immediately after

your animals. This is a particular problem in

Battery Park and the park area between the river and Bull Hill in the vicinity of the old Ferry Landing.
