Update on Repair Status of City Dikes

At the October 8th council meeting Council President William Barthel updated Council on the repair status of the city dikes.

President Barthel reported he had contacted Kevin Donnelly, District Coordinator for the New Castle Conservation District for a status report regarding the repairs.

According to the New Castle Conservation District, the Buttonwood Dike permit from the Army Corps of Engineers was issued on September 24th and a pre-construction meeting with Merit Construction Engineers was held on October 1st.

Zenith and Twin Span business partners have been made aware that the planned construction start on Buttonwood Dike repairs is October 21st.

The Army Creek Dike A. C. of E. permit was received on October 8th, and a pre-construction meeting with KC Construction is scheduled for October 11th with attendees from the City and Trustees invited to attend.

The projected start date for Army Creek Dike repairs is November 1st.

Both the Gambacorta Dike and Broad Marsh Dike are awaiting permits from the Army Corps of Engineers.

Code Enforcement Corner

Code Enforcement helps to maintain and improve the quality of life of New Castle City residents by administering an unbiased enforcement program to correct violations of City zoning, property maintenance and building codes;

Complaint forms are available at the City Offices or on the City Web site at newcastlecity.delaware.gov. Complaints are handled on a confidential basis; however, if feedback and/or updates are requested, name, address and phone number need to be provided with the complaint.

Special trash pick-up is required for anything over four (4) 35 Gallon/50 pound containers. Special Pick-ups will occur on your regular day. Arrangements must be made and paid for prior to the pick-up day. Items that are not picked up cannot be left out for the following week. To make arrangements for a special trash pick-up call or go

to the Public Works Dept. at the Trolley Barn, 900 Wilmington Rd, New Castle, DE, 302-322-9813 or 322-9808. **Please clean up after your animals**, wherever that may be.

Common property problems: a) Unregistered or inoperative vehicles; b) Trash accumulation; c) Indoor items stored outside; d) Parking on front lawn; e) Yard maintenance; f) Improperly stored trash/garbage or recycle containers; g) No displayed house numbers.

Leaf pick-up has started: City of New Castle residents may rake leaves from trees on their property along the curbside for pick up by City personnel.

No other material such as trash, garbage, rocks, stone, should be placed amongst leaves for pick up under the leaf collection program.
