Street Sweeping & Leaf Pick Up Work Together to Control Pollution in Area Waterways

Why is Street Sweeping important? In addition to making our City a more beautiful place, street sweeping removes accumulated debris before it can be washed into storm drains. A 2013 water-quality engineering study noted that urban litter control programs including street cleaning and leaf removal can reduce the amount of deposition of pollutants by as much as 50%.

No other material such as trash, garbage, rocks, stone, should be placed amongst leaves for pick up under the leaf collection program.

Special trash pick-up is required for anything over four (4) 35 Gallon/50 pound containers. Special Pick-ups will occur on your regular day. Arrangements must be made and paid for prior to the pick-up day. Items that are not picked up cannot be left out for the following week. City Code § 209-1 Removal of snow and ice required. The owner, tenant or occupant of any house or other building, or the owner of any improved or unimproved lot is responsible for the removal of snow/ice within 24 hours of the end of an event, with a three feet minimum passage width. (note: Please, do not throw snow into travel lanes of the streets.)
