Christmas Tree Recycling

The Public Works Department encourages City residents to recycle their live Christmas trees.



After the Holidays, remove all decorations, ornaments, tinsel, and the stand. Place your tree curbside, City crews to perform chipping operations as they are available.

No other material such as trash, branches, mulched grass & leaves or stone, should be placed amongst leaves for pick up under the leaf collection program.

Just in case...

a friendly "Snow Removal Reminder."

It is the responsibility of property owners to maintain the sidewalk in front of their property within 24 hours of the end of a weather event.

Removal of snow and ice are required. The owner,

tenant or occupant of any house or other building, or the owner of any improved or unimproved lot is responsible for the removal of snow/ice within 24 hours of the end of an event, with a three feet minimum passage width.



(note: Please do not throw snow into travel lanes of the streets.)
