Apply Now for Over 65 or Disability Tax Exemption, The Deadline is May 1st

The City offers an Over-65 property tax exemption and a Disability exemption. Both exemptions require residency and certain maximum yearly income requirements (single \$15,000 and married \$30,000, not including Social Security income) be met in order to qualify.

Disabled persons must provide written acknowledgment by Social Security or the Veterans Administration as proof of disability.

Individuals must apply to the City in person. To schedule an interview, contact the Finance Department at 322-9804. Interviews can be scheduled through May 1st.

The City, will perform an annual audit to maintain updated files and review current residence and income status. **The last day to apply is May 1st.**

Code Enforcement Corner

Code Enforcement helps to maintain and improve the quality of life for New Castle City residents by administering an unbiased enforcement program to correct violations of City zoning, property maintenance and building codes;

Complaint forms are available at the City Offices or on the City Web site at newcastlecity.delaware.gov. Complaints are handled on a confidential basis; however, if feedback and/or updates are requested, name, address and phone number need to be provided with the complaint.

This month's highlights; general reminders...

Property owners are responsible for the maintenance and repair of sidewalks and driveways.

nance and repair of sidewalks and driveways.

Grass must be maintained on a regular basis.

Trash and garbage left at curb for pick up must be stored in containers with lids at all times. Permissible times for placement must be observed.

No debris, junk, indoor furniture, appliance, etc. are to be stored on exterior properties.

Vehicles which are unregistered, wrecked, inoperable or missing any major components cannot be stored anywhere in the City except in a fully enclosed building.



Pet owners are responsible for cleaning up after their animals. This must be done immediately.
