Please be aware, City workers willnot empty any recyclebins thathave non-recyclablematerialsor garbage in them.

Please clean up after your animals, <u>Defecation on public or private property</u> prohibited; owner to remove feces. It shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly permit their dog, cat or oth-

er domestic animal to defecate upon any street, sidewalk or park, or upon any public or private property within the City of New Castle without

the consent of the owner or tenant of such private property.

Common property problems: a) Unregistered or inoperative vehicles; b) Trash accumulation; c) Indoor items stored outside; d) Parking on front lawn; e) Yard maintenance; f) Improperly stored trash/garbage or recycle containers; g) No displayed house numbers.

Leaf pick-up has started: City of New Castle residents may rake leaves from their property to the curbside for pick up by City personnel. No other material such as trash, branches, or stone, should be amongst the leaves.
