DOBBINSVILLE COMMUNITY MEETING

The Municipal Services Commission (MSC) would like to invite the residents of Dobbinsville to a Community Meeting to discuss a water main relining project.

Wednesday 11-30-16 at 4:00pm New Castle Police building 7 ½ Center Street New Castle, DE 19720

The Commission has approved a water main relining project which is scheduled to begin April 1, 2017. A Drinking Water Innovation and Technology Grant has been awarded to the MSC in the amount of \$50,000 which will assist with the cost of the estimated \$250,000 project. The water mains will be cleaned and relined with 3M Scotchkote Pipe Renewal Liner 2400. This process is expected to extend the life of these 1890's mains by an additional 50 years. Dobbinsville area was selected as it was determined, after recent acoustical testing, to have water mains at the end of their useful life. Please join us to hear more details regarding the project. Pamela A. Patone, General Manager, and other MSC employees will be on site to answer questions.

Code Corner Special Notice:

<u>DO</u> Rake your leaves to the curb. DON'T rake them into the Street.

NEVER mix any other vard/green waste in with leaves.

Leave other items out for the regular Wednesday yard waste pick-up. In the fall, the City of New Castle Public Works Department collects loose leaves; collection runs through the end of November, or until the majority of the leaves have fallen.

Leaves should be raked next to the curb for pick-up. Do not rake leaves into the street, those leaves can wash down the street and clog storm sewer grates when it rains. This can cause flooding and leeching of phosphorus into the river through wastewater. (This is an environmental violation, which may result in criticism and prosecution by DNREC.)

No other materials such as trash, garbage, grass, branches, rocks, stone, or other unsuitable material shall be placed amongst leaves for pick up under the leaf collection program. These items can clog and damage machinery. If improperly placed or contaminated with other debris, the leaves will not be picked up, and residents may be cited.
