## Trustees Annual Education Grant Fund Deadline to Apply July 1st

The "Trustees of New Castle Common Education Grant Fund" was established in 1983 for eligible residents of the City New Castle.

An applicant must be a senior in high school or a recent high school graduate who is entering freshman year in an accredited undergraduate college or university as a full-time student in the coming September.

Funded applicants from previous years who continue to be a **student in good standing** are invited to reapply for grant funding if available. The grants are awarded to residents of the City of New Castle. High school seniors must provide an acceptance letter from a college or university in order to be considered for a grant. If the applicant is a dependent, the parent must be a resident of the City of New Castle.

Application packets are available from the Trustees of New Castle Commons, 201 Delaware Street, New Castle. Please call 322-2809 with any questions about the process or about residency in the City of New Castle.

**Please note the application and necessary information must be received by the Education Grant Committee no later than July 1, 2017.**

## What is Emerald Ash Borer?

### Tree Advisory Commission news

- The Emerald Ash Borer attacks ash trees (and fringe trees.)
- The emerald ash borer has killed more than 40 million ash trees in many US states, including Delaware.
- Adults leave a D-shaped exit hole in the bark when they emerge in spring.
- Woodpeckers like EAB larvae; heavy woodpecker damage may be a sign of infestation.

## Sheriff's House Rehabilitation

There is good news on the horizon for the rehabilitation of the New Castle Sheriff's House. Now that the planning phase is drawing to a close and an Environmental Assessment is nearly complete, the National Park Service has funded the first phase of design planning, which will identify design requirements for re-use alternatives of the historic Sheriff's House. This design work is scheduled to begin within the coming months. The park is excited to see the project funded and is eager to be one step closer to having a permanent visitor facility in New Castle.
