Department is asking its citizens
to assist them in their crime
prevention and crime solving
efforts. The NCPD is introducing a
Security Camera Community

Registration Program.

This program will allow business and home owners to register their surveillance systems with the NCPD. This registration process will allow the NCPD to easily identify camera systems in the vicinity of a crime scene, and enable them to contact the owner for assistance in obtaining video evidence for their investigation. In many cases this will speed up cases and prosecution, which in turn will save money for the taxpayer by reducing the amount of man hours spent on an investigation.

This <u>will not</u> give the police the ability to freely access your cameras, claim ownership, or dictate the camera system's function. This is simply a database that will allow our police department to see who might have captured footage related to a crime.

- Listen to an informative presentation about the project.
- Speak with subject matter experts. Your participation will help guide the assessment of the New Castle's vulnerability to flooding and climate impacts as well as to inform the development and prioritization of adaptation strategies.

Hurricane and Storm Preparedness



A reminder that we are well into hurricane season, and it is important to plan ahead, and pay attention to hurricane and storm warning messages. Planning ahead can

reduce the chances of injury or major property damage.

Make a Plan: Before an emergency happens, sit down and make a plan. Share your plan with family and

friends so they will know how to contact you in case of an emergency. Keep a copy of this plan in your emergency supplies kit or another safe place where you can access it in the event of an emergency.

Check your Property: Check around the perimeter of your property for anything that could become airborne during a storm. Take in, or secure all outdoor

furniture, umbrellas, garbage cans, rakes and anything else that could be propelled into the air.

Communication: Battery conservation on your cell phone is essential during emergency situations. You can save your battery by reducing the backlight, and turning off extra features. Only use your phone when you absolutely need to. Here's an interesting fact, cell phones charge faster in airplane mode.

Basic Disaster Supplies Kit: A basic emergency supply kit should include the following items:

- · Water one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation.
- · Food at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food per person, and a <u>manual</u> can opener for food.
- · Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert.
 - · Flashlight & extra batteries.
 - · First aid kit/prescription medications
 - · Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation.
 - · Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities.
 - · Local maps.
 - · Cell phone and chargers
 - · Personal ID and cash.

Pets: Don't forget your pets when prepping your emergency kit. They will also need a

supply of food and water, as well as their medicines and medical records. Keep a leash handy, and having a picture of you and your pet will make identification easier should you become separated.
