# Christmas Tree Recycling



The Public Works Department encourages City residents to recycle their live Christmas trees.

After the Holidays, remove all decorations, ornaments, tinsel, and the stand. Place your tree curbside, City crews will perform chipping operations as they are available.

**The New Castle City Code, section 209-1:** Sidewalks require a minimum 3 feet of clearance within 24 hours of a snow event ending. Do not wait for warmer temperatures to clear the sidewalk.

Please clear fire hydrants whenever possible; this could save crucial minutes in an emergency.

Here are some tips, from our neighbors to the north for dealing with ice.

- **DO NOT** pile snow in the roadway.
- Warmer weather during the day can make ice soft, so it's easier to chip or shovel away.
- Spread sand or gravel on icy patches to make your sidewalk safer for pedestrians. Spreading sand on a sidewalk <u>before</u> ice forms can also make future ice easier to remove.
