## Resolution 2020-06

## A Resolution to Clarify and Amend Historic Area Commission Guidelines Streetscape Section to Address Paving Materials for Multi-Use Trails and Commercial/Institutional/Public Parking Lots.

**WHEREAS**, the current Historic Area Commission guidelines ("Guidelines") do not specifically address paving materials for multi-use <u>trails</u> (e.g., <u>walking and/or biking trails</u>, <u>paths and similar public passages not open to motor vehicles</u>, <u>excluding sidewalks</u>) and commercial/institutional/public parking lots; and

**WHEREAS**, multi-use trails and commercial/institutional/public parking lots in the City of New Castle have traditionally been macadam, asphalt or bituminous concrete (blacktop); and

**WHEREAS**, the Guidelines need to be clarified to provide better guidance to property owners and to Historic Area Commission members on the subject of paving materials for trails and commercial/institutional/public parking lots; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has the authority to propose and adopt changes of the Guidelines as authorized by paragraph 230-51 Proceedings of Historic Area Commission, section D of the City Code.

**THEREFORE**, the City Council hereby modifies the streetscape guidelines and standards section of the City of New Castle Historic Commission Streetscape Design Guidelines and Standards as follows (added language underlined):

Section 3. Curbs and Sidewalks:

e. The paving of sidewalks with asphalt is NOT appropriate, except (1) when required to provide barrier-free access (Refer to Barrier Free Access guidelines for additional information) and (2) multi-use trails. For purposes of this section, "multi-use trails" shall mean walking and/or bicycling trails, paths and similar public passages not open to motor vehicles, excluding sidewalks to accommodate pedestrians along roadways).

Section 4. Driveways and Off-street Parking:

e. Paving Materials.

v. The use of Macadam or bituminous concrete ("blacktop") is **NOT** appropriate adjacent to historic buildings, with the exception of (1) code-mandated barrier-free access amenities such as handicapped accessible parking spaces and access paths, which require hard-surface materials suitable for wheelchair use, and (2) commercial/institutional/public parking lots.
