**January is the time to
renew your City
Business & Rental
License's**

Now is the time to renew
your City of New Castle
Business License and Rental Housing
Business License.

All business's located in and/or
working within the city limits of New
Castle, must have a current New Castle
City business license.

All rental properties must have a
current New Castle City Rental Housing
Business License, both licenses must be
renewed annually in January.

License applications are available at the
City Administration Building, located at
220 Delaware Street.

Both licenses are also available and
payable online on the City website at
newcastlecity.delaware.gov on the
Forms & Fees page.



**Apply for City Property
Tax Exemptions starting
January 15th**

January 15th begins the new
cycle for city residents to apply for the
over 65 or disability property tax
exemption. To make an appointment,
at the convenience of the taxpayer, call
the Finance Department at 322-9804.
The maximum yearly income
requirements are \$15,000 for a single
person and \$30,000 for a married
couple. Social Security income is not
counted toward the maximum. The last
day to apply is April 30th.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE NEW CASTLE COMMON



Due to the resignation of Trustee Henry F. Gambacorta, the Trustees of the New Castle Common will hold an election from January 25, 2021 to February 6, 2021 to fill the vacancy. Interested candidates may file up to 3:00 PM December 24, 2020. Call (302) 322-2809 for information. Qualifications are listed on trusteesncc.org/elections.

DATES: January 25, 2021 to February 6, 2021.

PLACE: Town Hall, 201 Delaware Street

Precautions will be taken in light of the corona virus. Masks are required. Bring proper identification showing your current address and your own pen (pens will be provided as well).

Beginning on January 25, 2021, and ending on February 6, 2021 voting will be conducted at the Trustees' office at 201 Delaware Street. The following schedule will be followed:

Voters need to be registered on the Trustees' Voter List, and must have proper identification. Voter Registration will be available with documentation (Driver's license and MSC bill). Due to the corona virus, voting will be done outside the office. A mask must be worn, covering your mouth and nose. One voter at a time. A distance of at least six feet will be required between all persons in the voting area. Follow all posted instructions.

Absentee ballots will be available by mail. Mail ballots must be notarized. Call (302) 322-2809 to request that a ballot package be mailed to you. Requests will be taken starting on January 5, 2021, and stopping at end of day on January 27, 2021. Mail in ballots must be returned to the office by 2 p.m. on February 5, 2021.



Trustee Community
Grant Program

The Trustees of the New Castle Common have posted the 2021-2022

www.trusteesncc.org. Organizations within the town of New Castle can apply for grants. The Trustees mission is to manage its resources "for the benefit of the citizens of New Castle." Citizens are defined as the residents of the incorporated area of the City.

If an organization has activities both inside and outside of the New Castle City limits, the Trustees can only support those activities within the City. Information and documentation provided must clearly indicate the location of services provided.

Remember! Your organization must complete and return the "Grant Request Application" to the Trustees of the New Castle Common by December 31, 2020.

Code Enforcement Corner

Code Enforcement helps to maintain and improve the quality of life of New Castle City residents by administering an unbiased enforcement program to correct violations of City zoning, property maintenance and building codes; Complaint forms are available on the City Website, newcastlecity.delaware.gov. or at the City Offices. Complaints are handled on a confidential basis; however, if feedback and/or updates are requested, name, address and phone number need to be provided with the complaint.

TRASH/RECYCLE & YARD WASTE:

Place trash, yard waste and recycle at the curb the night before your scheduled pick-up day, this will insure your items will be picked up. All garbage is to be secured in plastic bags and placed inside solid containers (metal or plastic), with lids securely in place, each residence may place up to four (4) 35 gallon/50 pounds maximum at the curb for pick-up.



It is the responsibility of property owners to maintain the sidewalk in front of their property within 24 hours of the end of a weather event. If off-street parking is available, please move vehicles to facilitate plowing.

The New Castle City Code, section 209-1: Sidewalks require a minimum 3 feet of clearance within 24 hours of a snow event ending. If you have a neighbor who is unable to do this, think about helping out if you can. **Please remember to clear any fire hydrant; this could save crucial minutes in an emergency.**
