#### **City Property Tax Reminder**

### **Payment Deadline** Thursday, September 30th

City property tax payments are due in the City office at 220 Delaware Street by 4:30 p.m. on September 30th.

Any unpaid balance is subject to a 6% penalty as of October 1st, with an additional 1.5% per month accrued on all unpaid taxes.

#### **AVOID PENALTIES**

POSTMARKS ARE NOT ACCEPTED AS DATE OF PAYMENT. Payments received after the due date will be assessed late fees.

#### **Code Enforcement Corner** Garbage, Yard Waste & Recycle

The City Code Enforcement Department helps to maintain and improve the quality of life of New Castle City residents by administering an unbiased enforcement program to correct violations of City zoning, property maintenance and building codes. Complaint forms are available on the City website at <u>newcastlecity.delaware.gov</u> or in the City offices; you can <u>business day</u> to pick-up. special trash pick-ups are made on also call the Code Officer at 322-9801.

§ 204-6 Rules and regulations governing disposition and collection of garbage, and refuse.

Place trash, yard waste and recycle at the curb the night before your scheduled pick-up day, this will insure your items will be picked up.

TRASH & TRASH CONTAINERS: All garbage is to be secured in plastic bags and placed inside solid

containers (metal or plastic), with lids securely in place, each residence may place up to four (4) 35 gallon/50 pounds maximum at the curb for pick-up. Removal of Trash Containers: All containers must be removed from the sidewalk or roadway and stored on the same day that they are picked up. Containers shall be placed or stored in the rear of residential dwellings, or along the side yards or alleyways but not within five feet of the front of the dwelling unless concealed by a fence.

> **RECYCLE:** Placement and removal times for your recycle container is the same as for normal trash. Please place recycle items UNBAGGED in a container. If you are unsure of what is recyclable please contact Delaware Solid Waste Authority at

800-404-7080 or visit their website at www.DSWA.com. DSWA also offers hazardous waste disposal, paper shredding and electronic recycle at no cost.

SPECIAL TRASH PICK-UP: (appliances, bedding, furniture, excess trash or other large items,) A special trash pick-up can be arranged by calling the City Administration Building at 322 -9801. Arrangements must be made and paid for at least 1 your regular trash day; do not put out items until you have received confirmation. Special Trash Pick-up Form is available online! Now you can schedule and pay for a special trash pick-up online. The special trash pick-up form is available on the City website on the forms & Fees page. LEAF COLLECTION & YARD WASTE: Leaf collection starts in October with the first falling leaves, and continues as long as needed. Rake only leaves to

the curb (not in the street) and they will be collected throughout the week as teams are Mulched leaves, grass clippings and available. branches cannot be picked up by the leaf vacuum

> truck, leave these items out for Wednesday yard waste pick-up.

Yard waste including branches, tree trimmings, sticks, grass clippings are collected Wednesdays\*. Containers or plastic bags do not

need to be used for yard waste. Such refuse may be securely tied together in bundles, each of which shall not exceed 50 pounds in weight or four feet in length. Grass clippings and other garden refuse can be bagged not to exceed 50 pounds in weight. Please call 302-9801 if you have any questions.
