#### <u>Trustees Scholarship Fund</u> Applications are Available Now

The "Trustees of New Castle Common Scholarship Fund" was established in 1983 to support the higher education of eligible residents of the City of New Castle.

The scholarships are awarded to full-time residents of the City of New Castle and are for undergraduate study only. High school seniors must provide an acceptance letter from a college or university to be considered for the Scholarship. If the applicant is a dependent, the parent must also be a resident of the City of New Castle.

A new applicant must be a senior in high school or a high school graduate who is entering an accredited undergraduate college or university as a full-time student in the coming Fall semester. Previously funded applicants must complete another application at this time and provide an <u>official</u> Spring 2022 grade transcript prior to the <u>July 1, 2022</u> deadline.

#### Municipal Services Commission 2022 Annual Hydrant Flushing Program

The Municipal Services Commission Water Department will begin our annual Fire Hydrant Flushing Program on Monday, June 20th. Flushing will begin at 7:30am and end at 3:00pm Monday through Friday taking approximately 10 business days to complete. Our Hydrant Flushing Program is important to our water system and is an integral part of our goal to deliver the safest and highest quality water possible. Additionally, it ensures fire protection is available by testing the operation of our hydrants.

The Municipal Services Commission schedules our flushing program when demands are lower using a carefully planned route to control the direction of flow with in the distribution system. Customers should not experience service interruptions during the flushing process.

The flushing process may cause some temporary water discoloration. There is no health hazard associated with the discolored water. If you notice discolored water, run several cold water taps at the same time until the water is clear. Avoid using your cold or hot water and doing laundry until you are certain the water is clear.

The Municipal Services Commission urges all residents to exercise caution while traveling around the hydrant flushing crews as water may accumulate in the flushing area.

# Municipal Services Commission Rate Increase

The Municipal Services Commission (MSC) was notified in April that the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) had approved NRG Energy to charge Delaware electric customers with a "Reliability Must Run Rate Schedule" for Indian River Power Plant Unit #4.

NRG Energy is a generation owner that provides generation for the electric grid. NRG states that the unit is no longer economical to run and filed to shutter Unit #4. Unit #4 is the last coal fired unit at this facility. Units #1, #2, and #3 were retired under a consent decree reached with Delaware Department of Natural Resources.

FERC will not allow the unit to go off line as it creates a reliability concern for the transmission grid. The "Reliability Must Run Rate Schedule" filed by NRG allows \$5.8 Million a month or \$69.6 Million per year to be passed on to Delaware rate payers.

Delaware Municipal Electric Corporation (DEMEC) the MSC's Joint Action Agency filed a protest for is eight members. The current rate increase expectation for MSC customers is 2%. The MSC is working with their Rate Consultant to design the appropriate rate structure. With recent inflation and the uncertainty in the economy the MSC was informed that the charges passed on by NRG could easily double.

The charges from NRG are expected to affect Delaware rate payers for the next 5 years as Delmarva Power makes improvements to the transmission grid. When there is no longer a reliability concern then the Indian River Power Plant Unit #4 will be allowed to close and the charges no longer passed on.

These charges were approved by FERC to become effective starting with the June 2022 Billing. DEMEC is working to mitigate the rate increase for the short term while its members analyze the impact to their rate structures.
