



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The Trustees of the New Castle Common are holding an election on April 13, 2024 to fill one vacant position. This election will be held at the Goodwill Fire Station, 401 South Street, from 10 AM TO 4 PM.

Register to Vote

If you are not already registered to vote in Trustee elections, you can register at the Trustees' office, located at 807 Frenchtown Road, New Castle, DE 19720, on Penn Farm. Office hours are Monday through Thursday, 10 AM to 3:30 PM. New registrations will be accepted on Election day up to the end of voting at 4 PM and you can register and vote at the same time on Election day. To qualify, you must be at least 18 years old by the date of the election, April 13, 2024 and a resident of the City for at least one year prior to the date of the election.

Bring proper identification to prove residency and age. If your identification document(s) shows an address outside of the City of New Castle, you are not eligible.

Mail-in voting will be offered. Please call the Trustees' office by March 10, 2024, to request a ballot by mail. The telephone number is: 302-322 -2809, Extension 1. Ballots, once printed can also be picked up in person at the Trustees' office.

To be a candidate in this election you must file at the Trustees' office by close of business, 3:30 PM, on Wednesday, March 13, 2024.

Candidates must meet the following criteria:

- Be a citizen of the United States
- Prove residency in the City of New Castle for at least two years preceding the election date, April 13, 2024;
- Be at least 25 years old by the election date;
- Be registered on the Trustees Current Voter List;



Code Enforcement Corner

Code Enforcement helps to maintain and improve the quality of life for New Castle City residents by administering an unbiased enforcement program to correct violations of City zoning, property maintenance and building codes.

You can call the Code Enforcement office at 302-322-9801 or complaint forms are available in the City Office or on the City Web site at

<u>newcastlecity.delaware.gov.</u> Complaints are handled on a confidential basis; if feedback and/or updates are requested, name, address and phone number need to be provided with the complaint.

This month's highlights; general reminders:

• Property owners are responsible for the

maintenance and repair of sidewalks and driveways.

- Grass must be maintained on a regular basis. Trash and garbage left at curb for pick up must be stored in containers with lids at all times. Permissible times for placement must be observed.
- No debris, junk, indoor furniture, appliance, etc. are to be stored on exterior properties.
- Vehicles which are unregistered, wrecked, inoperable or missing any major components cannot be stored anywhere in the City except in a fully enclosed building.
- Pet owners are responsible for cleaning up after their animals. This must be done immediately.
