Understanding your City of New Castle Property Tax Bill

Tax bills were mailed in July. Please note: the City does not accept a postmark to qualify payment as on time. Payment must be received in our office either by mail or in person by the close of business on the due date.

The last day to apply for the Senior Citizen Property Tax Exemption and Disability Tax Exemption is September 1st. Please call 302 -322-9804 for an appointment.

The City offers a 2% discount if payment is received at the City office by 4:30 p.m. on August 29th.

From September 1st through September 30th the base tax amount is due.

Payment must be received at the City office by 4:30 p.m. on September 30th.

Please see below for late fee penalty schedule:

- October 1st a 1.5% penalty
- November 1st 1.5% penalty

 December 1st a 6% late penalty with an additional 1% per month accrued on all unpaid taxes.

For your convenience the City has 3 ways to pay your tax bill:

Pay in Person at the City office: 220 Delaware Street (Cash, Check or Money Order Only.)

Pay online by credit or debit card or by echeck on the City's website: www.newcastlecity.delaware.gov

Please be aware, there are convenience fees associated with paying your bill online. Fees over and above your taxes are not kept by the City. E-checks are mailed by your financial institution and must arrive by close of business one due date.

Pay by mail (Please note, payment must be received by September 30th. A postmark of September 30th will not be accepted as on time payment.)

PLEASE HELP THE CITY CONTROL WILDLIFE AND FERAL CAT COLONY PROBLEMS... DO NOT FEED WILD ANIMALS OR FERAL CATS.



According to the National Geographic Society, feeding wildlife is generally a bad idea. Food-seeking squirrels bite more people than any other animal in National Parks. Also, providing

food for wildlife teaches those animals to associate humans with food. This can make them more likely to get hit by cars, or get into altercations with children or pets.

- Make sure all garbage is secured in covered plastic or metal trash containers.
- Keep yards clean and mowed and cleared of any debris including: compost, piles of wood, lumber or rocks and junk. Also, clean outdoor grills regularly.
- ♦ Eliminate all protective cover. Clear any brush areas or hedge rows.
- Close up any open areas that provide access under structures, porches or decks that could be used as potential den sites.
- Clean up any pet food, bird seed, fruits or vegetables

- that may have accumulated.
- If there is any evidence of a den, make sure the animals are gone and fill hole with dirt and rocks. Sprinkle flour on the ground to detect tracks.
- ♦ If your yard has a grub or other subsoil insect problem, these are a feast for skunks.
- Raccoons and skunks may carry rabies and distemper, so keep pet vaccinations up to date.

What is a "Feral Cat?"



Both stray and feral cats live outdoors, where they can find food and shelter. The difference is that stray cats are usually lost or abandoned house pets - cats who are friendly with humans and can often be re-adopted. In contrast, feral

cats are domestic cats that are not socialized to human contact. They live in all kinds of settings, usually in family groups called colonies. Because they have not been socialized to human contact, feral cats older than 2 months are generally not adoptable.

It is <u>vitally</u> important <u>not</u> to feed feral cats; if they have an unlimited food supply the colony will stay and grow. Feeding these cats will also attract other undesirable wildlife such as raccoons and skunks.

TNVR (Trap-Neuter-Vaccinate-Return) is a humane and effective program that ends the birth of unwanted litters, stabilizes the cat populations, improves the quality of life for the cats themselves, and prevents the spread of disease.
